## **Reading for Pleasure**

As you will know, reading is at the heart of Crown Street Primary School. It is without doubt the most important academic skill we can teach our pupils. The teaching of Reading In Early Years and Year 1 is done through Phonics Scheme FFT Success for All (more information can be found on our Academic Curriculum Page <u>here</u>).

However, as well as learning to read, the lessons we learn from stories and the enjoyment we get from spending time in a book is of equal importance. At Crown Street we want to nurture this love of reading and want to do this from the very beginning of your child's time with us by building our curriculum around books and using books to support our teaching and learning. Some of the ways we use books and encourage reading are:

- Through our termly curriculum bookshelves
- Using books to support different areas of learning
- Having books available and accessible within the continuous provision
- Having daily story time in Reception they currently hold a book vote each day to choose this book
- Using books within assemblies and use to discuss our character traits and/or School rules
- Encouraging book talk and discussions with pupils and adults in school!
- Through weekly library visits


#### What can you do as parents to nurture this love of reading?

Amongst many other things, you need to show your children that you read and make time for reading - for both them and yourself, model your own passion for it, make an event of visiting the library or a bookshop (or the book section of the supermarket) and let your child take the lead in what they want to read.

Making time for reading is one of the most important things you can do – 10 minutes a day can have a huge positive impact. So, make a routine to read and stick with it. This can be reading to your child, with them, them reading to you (even if that is just them turning the pages and pointing to words/pictures), it can be reading the same book you've read every night for the last 2 weeks (it's currently Funny Bones in my house – every night since Halloween!). I say this as a teacher, but also as a parent - there are few things more significant you can do for your child (and your relationship with them) than sharing daily reading experiences - so grab a book, get comfy and enjoy.
